### Maths at home Update

White Rose Maths Booklets: The home-learning workbooks that can be downloaded and printed at home or worked on directly on the screen, complement the White Rose Schemes of Learning which we at West Jesmond follow. They link directly to the daily maths video lessons that the children can access. The same work is assigned to those pupils within Key worker provision. The topics are divided up into relevant blocks across the Spring term. The children will already have covered some of the work at the start of the books but the questions within these pages could where necessary be utilised to recap their understanding further.

Please ensure that relevant work is completed within the linked lesson and on the specific day it is assigned. Pupils are not expected to attempt other pages within the books in advance – no matter how keen pupils or parents may be! Specific teaching input within the daily sessions is necessary and indeed vital to deepen and further embed pupil knowledge and understanding.

We have purchased a number of The White Rose printed home learning workbooks for those families who are unable to access or print out at home and we can arrange for parents to collect them or have them delivered, if this is possible. Please contact us if you need a booklet.

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#### **Mathletics**

Please continue to encourage your child to use Mathletics on a regular basis as it is a very useful tool for us in school to see their areas of strength and areas to develop within the subject. This programme also aligns directly with the White Rose Curriculum. Mathletics awards will continue to be awarded virtually to the year group that acquires the highest number of points on a weekly basis. We also seek to acknowledge individual Mathletes efforts within each year group.

#### **Times Tables Rockstars**

Improving the speed of recall of times tables facts is key to pupils gaining confidence within the subject. Our aim is for all pupils to know their times tables facts by the end of Year 4 – an ambition set centrally by the DFE. Pupils can utilise this programme to improve their response times in a fun, competitive way – eventually achieving Rock Hero status! Again pupil's efforts and perseverance in this aspect of maths will be celebrated.

Pupils should have log ins for both Mathletics and Times Tables Rockstars. If you require further assistance in accessing these programmes then please contact your child's teacher via their email address.

# **On-line Reading Scheme: Oxford Reading Owl**



We are very sorry that we cannot exchange reading books at this time and therefore we have been looking to find an online resource to allow all of our children to access reading materials.

West Jesmond has subscribed to **Oxford Reading Owl,** which provides an online library of eBooks. These eBooks are suitable for Reception to Year 6 and mirror the **Oxford Reading Tree** reading scheme which Key Stage 1 use, and the **Treetops** reading scheme used by Years 3, 4 and 5. ### Years 1 to 5

It is possible to search the online library by book band or level. If your child is in Years 1 to 5, they will already have a book band level assigned by their teacher. If you are unsure of which level this is, look in your child's Reading Diary or contact their class teacher. Please try to stay within the level suggested by the teacher as this is based on prior assessment, so the books will be most suited to enhancing your child's decoding and comprehension skills.

## **Reception and Year 6**

Your children are not yet assigned a level. Therefore, we would recommend that you search the books by age rather than level. There are plenty of titles for both year groups – happy searching!

## An update from Breakfast and After School Club
