Make a pattern by pushing the seeds into the apple, then it's ready to hang up!

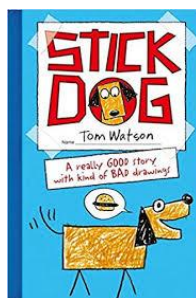
### Wind Chimes
