Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been an appropriately thoughtful and reflective week in school; perhaps even a little sombre as we've been collectively learning about WW1 and marking the centenary of the Armistice.

School has been awash with poppies; gently and with care, staff have supported children to better understand the terrible losses suffered, across many nations, in order to preserve the freedoms and liberties we enjoy today.



All classes in school have had the opportunity to explore the WW1 Box of Delights kindly loaned to us from The Discovery Museum. Children were able to interact with the artefacts and see how the objects can give us a real life insight into events from the past. Classes from years 1-6 paid a visit to Jesmond United Reform Church, Here, their honorary archivist Robert Shiel gave the children fascinating insight into members of the Church who went to fight in WW1. Some children also paid the war graves in the cemetery a visit to show their respect. In years 5 and 6 Dr James McConnell, a WW1 specialist from Northumbria University, came to give us a talk all about the role of Empires and propaganda in the Great War.

The children's writing and art work will be on display at the United Reform Church over the weekend. The effort that has gone into homework activities has been much appreciated too – some fascinating stories have been uncovered and retold within school.
