Pick Up Reminders

Please could you complete the section at the back of the reading diary regarding 'who is picking me up'. It would be very helpful for class teachers to have a reference.

Drop off and Pick up Staggered timings

Breakfast Club 8.00 am	
Year 2, 4 and 6 8.30 – 8.45 am	3.05 – 3.20 pm
Year 1, 3 and 5 8.45 – 9.00 am	3.20 – 3.35 pm
Reception 8.45 – 9.00 am	3.20 – 3.35 pm
After School Club	3.30 – 5.55 pm

If possible do drop your child off at the gate and let them come into school on their own under our staff supervision.

Year 1 and Year 4 Gate

Thank you to the parents for your patience as we know this area has been tricky to navigate. There will be a new system from Monday.

Drop Off

Y4 - please can all children be dropped at the gate and make their own way across the yard to the staff at the door. Any bikes or scooters can be left in the Disabled Bay and staff will move these to outside the Y2 classrooms. If you have a buggy please enter and leave via the Y2/3 Gate.

Y1 - If any children are confident enough to be dropped at the gate, please do so. Staff will be on hand to guide them to the classroom. Any bikes or scooters can be left in the Disabled Bay and staff will move these to outside the Y1 classrooms. For any parents dropping at the door, please then leave via the same gate. If you have a buggy, please enter and leave via the Y2 and Y3 gate and walk around the back of the Y2 classrooms.

Pick Up

Y4 - please could parents enter the yard via the Y1/4 Gate and collect any bikes or scooters from outside the Y2 classrooms, collect your child and then leave via the Reception gate. Please can you walk round the back of the Reception parents and not along the Reception classroom fence

as this is a one way system in the other direction. If you have a buggy please enter via the Y2/3 Gate and leave via the Reception Gate.

Y1 - Please enter and leave via the Y1/4 gate. If you have a buggy, please enter and leave via the Y2 and Y3 gate and walk around the back of the Y2 classrooms.

General

- Please do pick up your child or children and leave the site as quickly as possible
- For the time being, please could you not bring in any uniform donations to the school as we do not have space to quarantine large amounts of old school uniform.

Parent and Pupil Safety

As you will be aware we are a large school on a very small Victorian site. Originally, this was an infant school designed for just four classes of 60 pupils (240 rather than 630 pupils).

We have very small pavements and Tankerville Terrace with the difficult junction has to cope with all the traffic from the Royal grammar School, Newcastle High School for Girls, Percy Hedley special school and of course ourselves. Congestion has eased throughout the week and thank you to parents that have now reconsidered their parking arrangements. We are continuing to try and work with the council to see what we can do to further improve road safety.

Please remember that I or any other members of staff or governors have absolutely no jurisdiction or legal enforcement powers over the pavements or road system in Jesmond.

Whilst we have done our best to stagger entry and dismissal we are aware of problems the geography of our site causes. We have allowed parents onto the school site to ease this congestion (many schools have not allowed this) and have organised our pick up and entry gate systems to distribute pupils and parents as best we can.

A number of parents have been very concerned at the proximity of other parents at the start and end of the day so please do your very best to social distance and if possible wear a mask to protect yourself and other parents.

By working together we can make our site as safe as possible for us all.

MUSIC LESSONS

Our peripatetic music teachers have been invited back into school to resume teaching.

Instrumental lessons will take place in the school hall, so that social distancing advice can be followed, and children will only be taught within their year group 'bubbles'. It is not possible for children to share instruments at this time, so it is really important that pupils remember to bring their own or their allocated hire instrument, on the right day.

We will keep you informed, via this newsletter, of days when instrumental teachers will be in school.

This week, we are happy to announce that Ms. Montgomery will be in school next MONDAY morning 14th September and Ms. Harrison will be in school next TUESDAY afternoon 15th September.

Please can all string pupils bring their instruments into school on the day of their lesson, taking them to their classrooms, where they can be stored safely until needed. Ms. Montgomery and Ms.

Harrison will let class teachers know when it is time for children to come to the hall for their lessons.
