I was at a very interesting conference last Friday to launch 'Newcastle as a City of Languages'. I was talking to a very engaging student from Newcastle University who volunteers to run a multicultural language library supported by the Kittiwake Trust. The library is in Eldon Garden shopping centre on the Upper Level and is open Monday to Saturday 11 am to 8 pm. They have books in 83 languages and the group is run by people from 12 countries around the world. They also host regular open conversation classes to support people learning languages.
