Many thanks to everyone who came along to our **Friends PTA AGM**. It was lovely to see some new faces! In particular it was fantastic to look back at a year of fundraising which has raised £16,000 for school. Alongside fundraising towards our Secret Garden project the **PTA will also fund the following projects** this year:

£200 lego club; £200 drones for coding club; £34 back packs for running clubs; £2700 new school piano; £650 Living eggs project; £54 Shakespeare costume; £220 Animal Antics; £800 practical maths resources; £1270 parent pupil library; Learning Garden £500; £80 Knitting club; £200 Year 1 learning garden; £300 attendance awards; £1000 for outdoor sports and play equipment for the yard.
