Ouseburn Learning Trust

West Jesmond is part of the Ouseburn Learning Trust with six other local primary schools; Benton Park, Chillingham Road, Christchurch, Cragside, Hotspur and Ravenswood. The aim of the trust is to work collaboratively and offer support and expertise in all areas of school life. This week, all teaching members of staff from the trust schools came together at the Great North Museum. This was the first in a series of training sessions on disciplinary knowledge led by the Deputy Heads. Over the course of the year we will be focusing on planning science and humanities lessons to further develop the skills our children need to be a geographer, historian and scientist. This was an excellent opportunity to share ideas and experiences in year group teams across the trust.


Friends of West Jesmond

These donations really help us, so it would be great if you could take a moment to get started. Ask your friends and family to sign up too! If you are buying something online, instead of going to the store website directly, use the **easyfundraising** app or website to find the store link (lots of brands are part of the scheme, so it's always worth checking). Click through and make your purchase – the price will

be the same. The store will then make a donation to the Friends of West Jesmond Primary School. As an example, your weekly online grocery shop alone could generate a donation of £80 a year for our school!

Black History Month at West Jesmond Primary
