Underneath each teacher you will be able to see the previous year's class name – for example Mrs Mathews will be teaching the class currently taught by Mr McGrath. You'll also notice that the current Year 2 and the current Year 4 will be mixed into new class groups for next year. To help us arrange these new classes groupings, in time for transition days in July, it would be really helpful to know as soon as possible if you and your child(ren) are moving on to pastures new. We'll obviously be very sad to see you go...

You may also have noticed that there are the equivalent to four full time teachers in Year 1 We've experimented next year. very successfully with similar models of staff deployment in Year 6 in recent years. This will allow us to enhance the crucial transition between Reception and the Early years curriculum to Year 1 and the National Curriculum. Mrs Robinson and Mrs Young will be working with children across all three classes in the Year 1 shared area. In this shared area children will have the chance to access many of the curriculum enhancements familiar to them from Reception but, where appropriate, at a more complex and challenging level; particularly as the year develops. We hope this change will prove highly effective in supporting our Year 1 children next year.

I am also delighted to welcome Mr Kristoffer Connelly to our staff for next year. Kris has trained this year within our School Direct partnership at Cragside and Hotspur Primaries and will be working alongside Mrs Laidler and Mr Farooqi in Year 3 next year. He is a very keen artist, animator and loves working with Raspberry Pi computers. So next year will no doubt be an exciting and creative year for children in Y3C!
