She painted big pictures of flowers using oil paints in bright and strong colours. Try looking closely at one part of a flower and drawing or painting what you can see? Maybe you could use a magnifying glass to help you see the detail?





Georges Seurat

George realised that if tiny dots of colour were painted close together, then when someone looked at them, their eyes would blend the dots to make a solid colour. To create a painting similar to Georges Seurat you could draw a simple picture and then use a cotton bud to fill each section with different coloured paints.
