The Governing Body hope that all our school community are well and coping with these extraordinary circumstances.

We would like to thank the school staff and leaders for everything they have done and are doing to provide support for our most vulnerable children and our key worker families. I have had lots of feedback from parents to say that the smiles from the staff, their positivity and the way the closure was managed was appreciated.

We would also like to thank you for helping school manage this situation. I am enjoying seeing the pictures on social media of children busy at home and pleased that there is still that feeling of a community.

As you will know, before the "lockdown", we were recruiting a new Headteacher. The coronavirus has disrupted our efforts! We have had some expressions of interest and are keeping in touch with those potential candidates but have paused the process for now. We considered holding video interviews etc but decided against it; appointing a new Headteacher is a hugely important job and we didn't want to limit the process in anyway. We also felt that it was unfair to ask potential candidates to go through interviews etc when they had enough to do running their own schools in these circumstances. We will restart the recruitment process as soon as we can and, as you know, Gary Wallis-Clarke has offered to support us over the Autumn Term.
