General

 reasons we cannot have our large communal trolley on the yard anymore so please put
 your child's name on their uniform.
- As our local infection rate continues to rise please could we urge parents to wear face coverings when you know social distancing around the school site and on the pavements will be difficult to manage.

By working together we can make our school as safe as possible for us all. We are doing this to try and protect everyone and follow the official guidance; it is not to be difficult or make life harder than necessary.

Testing

If you feel your child has any of the three major symptoms of COVID19 (A relatively constant high temperature or fever, a harsh dry cough that will not stop for significant periods or a sudden loss of taste and smell) you should inform school and then isolate for 14 days or until you have had a test and received a negative result. Seek advice from 111.

Please do not send your child back to school until the isolation period is over or you have received a negative result.

Please note we have bene informed that if your child has phlegmy cough, runny nose, sinus pain, headaches, shivers etc it is very likely that it is a cold and suitable normal cold and flu medication will help your child, but you should monitor them carefully until they feel better.
