Monday

Read your favourite fairy tale.

Wednesday

Hotseating - Choose to be a character from your favourite fairy tale. Get your family to ask you questions about your role in the story. Remember to answer as if you are that character.

Thursday

Recap your favourite fairy tale - ask your family to help you act out the story, or can you use toys to act out the story as a show for your family?

Friday

Choose a book from Epic or Oxford Owls to read.



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Monday

Today we are practising the sound 'ai' as in wait, pain, sail, aim, tail, rain. Try practising to read and write these words. Can you challenge yourself and put them in the sentence?

Once you finished, get a piece of paper and make a poster about the sound 'ai'. In your poster try to include as many words as you can think of. Draw some colourful pictures to go with the words.

<u>Practise</u>: select the sound 'ai' and help Jay and Kay, the aliens, to read and sort the words.

Tuesday

Today we are practising the sound 'ee' as in see, feel, feet, meet, deep, keep. Can you read and write these words?

Now try think of some questions with the words that have sound 'ee' in them. Write the questions down. Remember the right punctuation at the end of the question.

<u>Practise</u>: select the sound ee and help phonics frog make it home through the busy road. Remember the frog can jump just on the real words' logs.

Wednesday

Today we are practising the sound 'igh' as in high, night, fight, might, tight, tonight. Can you read and write these words?

Let's play Yes/No questions. Read the questions and use your thumps up or thumbs down to show whether the answer is yes or no.

Is it light at night? Can a fox sail?

Will it rain tonight? Can a rat feel pain?

Can a dog fight?

Thursday

Today we are practising the sound 'oa' as in goat, coat, boat, road, soap, goal. Try to read and write these words. Can you think of any other words that may have the sound 'oa'?

Now play phonics hopscotch in your garden! With a piece of chalk draw 12 squares (a pattern of 1 square, 1 square and then 2 squares). Write some words with the sounds you have been practising over these two weeks – sh, ch, th, ng, ai, ee, igh and oa. Say the word you land on. Happy hopping!

<u>Practise</u> phase 3 tricky words by doing a word search.
