A high temperature.

This means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back. 38 degrees or above.



A new, continuous cough.

This means coughing a lot for more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours.



A loss or change to your sense of smell and taste.

This means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste. different to normal. (anosmia)





Only get tested if experiencing any of the three symptoms listed

even if isolating because of close contact with a confirmed

SCENARIO 1

Pupil or staff member develops symptoms of Covid-19 while at home.



Pupil or staff member develops symptoms of Covid-19 while at school.

SCENARIO 3

Household member of pupil or staff develops **symptoms** of Covid-19

SCENARIO 4

Pupil or staff member is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid-19 (but does not live in the same household) and has been told to isolate by NHS test and Trace (not 111)

SCENARIO 5

Pupil or staff member lives with someone who is isolating due to an outbreak at their school/workplace.

- Do not return to school for at least 10 days from the onset of symptoms.
- Follow Government guidance for households with possible infection.
- Seek advice from NHS 111 online or call NHS 111.
- Get tested and inform school immediately upon receipt of result.
- Send home (& any siblings) (follow flowchart and avoid public transport)
- Do not return for at least 10 days after the onset of symptoms.
- Follow Government guidance for households with possible infection.
- All household members stay at home and do not attend school.
- Symptomatic household members should be tested.
- Stay at home and do not come to school for 14 days.
- Follow the Government guidance for contacts of people with possible or confirmed coronavirus.
- Continue to attend school unless someone in the household develops symptoms (or instructed to isolate by GP/Public Health authorities)
- If symptoms develop in a household member, follow SCENARIO 3, or if a pupil/staff member develops symptoms, follow SCENARIO 1.

If the test is negative, pupil or staff member can return to school when they have not displayed the symptoms above and feel well enough to do so.

If the test is inconclusive pupil or staff member must keep self-isolating and have another test within 5 days of symptoms starting.

If the test is positive, school will follow the guidance of the local Health Protection Team to identify further actions required.

If the test is negative and no-one else in the household has developed symptoms, the pupil/staff member can return to school.

If the test is inconclusive or positive, the pupil or staff member must continue to isolate for at least 10 days. All other household members need to stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. If you still have a temperature you should continue to self-isolate and seek medical advice. You do not need to self-isolate after 10 days if you only have a cough or loss of sense of smell or taste, as these symptoms can last for several weeks after the infection has gone. If anyone else in the household starts displaying symptoms they need to stay at home for at least 10 days from when their symptoms appear regardless of what day they are on in their original 14 day isolation.

If the pupil or staff member develops symptoms in the isolation period, follow **SCENARIO 1**.
