On Tuesday, Yohan and Hamza from Year 6 were named as winners of the Primary Engineer Rail Project at the Discovery Museum. In Design & Technology, the Year Six children had been tasked with building trains, where they developed structural and electrical engineering skills as part of a national project. Yohan and Hamza's train was chosen to represent West Jesmond at the celebration



event this week along with representatives of other local schools that participated in the project. Their train was assessed on its structural integrity, how well they had constructed it, how well it could travel in a straight line and how well it managed to pull a series of carriages. The boys were also given a 15 minute interview to discuss their design and construction process, and the judges commented on how precise and well-assembled their train was. 
#### **Strike Partial Closures**

# Year 6 Shakespeare Theatre Review

We wanted to share with you this fantastic review of our Year 6 production of Twelfth Night performed at the Northern Stage just before Easter.

# IF MUSIC BE THE FOOD OF LOVE, PLAY ON"

Twelfth Night by West Jesmond Primary School at Northern Stage, 29<sup>th</sup> March 2023 appraised by Duncan Riches

I want to take this opportunity to congratulate you, West Jesmond Primary School for your marvellous interpretation of Twelfth Night as part of the Spring 22/23 Shakespeare Schools Festival. It was a great night at the theatre, and I'd like to take this time here to mention a few things that I really loved!

This was the funniest Twelfth Night I have seen in a long time! Your work as an ensemble, your characterisation, your physical comedy, it was all on point. You all had such good concentration during your rehearsals, which made it all run smoothly. Speaking of tech, the music choice for the opening sequence with the shipwreck was excellent. It was full of danger and set up the story so well, showing the dramatic separation of Viola and Sebastian.

You made every character so unique and took real ownership of your interpretations. I loved how cocky and cool Orsino was, in contrast to the more mellow Olivia; Viola was placid and nothing really fazed her, and you could tell Sebastian was her brother in their similar characterstics. The really boisterous Sir Toby with the slightly more timid yet up-for-a-laugh Sir Andrew was an excellent pairing, especially with the worldly wise and cunning Maria. Malvolio really shone, showing the boisterous and 'no nonsense' attitude they have for silliness, but also the devotion for Olivia. Also the teddy was a real laugh out loud moment!

Added to this were the pitch perfect ensemble who created the environments the characters found themselves in, such as the garden, all the guards and servants. I loved Orsino's two 'secret service' agents. The narration was so well delivered and felt very conversational. It made the performance really come alive and the energy never dropped.

This was a funny and playful Twelfth Night from a dedicated cast.

We're thrilled to back in a theatre with you again this year and have been so impressed by your commitment, bravery and resilience. We hope that you and your teachers are very proud of what you have achieved.
