#### The Friends of West Jesmond: A Message from Mr Jones

One of my (many!) roles at West Jesmond is being Co-Vice Chair of the Friends of West Jesmond. When I first joined the school 10 years ago, I was amazed with what an incredible body of volunteers the Friends is and how their fund raising has given so many great opportunities for your children. Sadly the pandemic years curtailed the opportunities for fundraising and with that the profile of the Friends has possibly decreased, especially with newer parents. We know that not all parents are fully aware of who the Friends are and what they do so here's a quick guide...

Who are we? We are a group of parents and staff. Some members hold committee roles - some of which are shared between two people.

What do we do? We organise events throughout the academic year for parents and children that help fundraise for projects in school. For example, the Christmas and Summer Fairs, cake stalls, parent quizzes, discos. We have one AGM a year and then groups meet to organise events.

Where does our fundraising go? Where doesn't it go is probably a quicker answer! Staff in school can apply for funds to help enhance the children's experiences at West Jesmond. In the past there have been big fundraising events for the trim trails, funding for additional pupil iPads - this year we are raising money for a makeover of the Key Stage 1 yard. ## **Northumbria Police Advice**

Northumbria Police's Prevention Through Education team contact us on a regular basis. Their advice to parents from the summer newsletter is: **Do you know which apps your children are using?** It's important for the adults in a child's life to be aware of what and who they are interacting with online, and for young people to be aware that what they share online can affect their lives in the 'real' world. For example, sharing their location (school, home) via images can give those who wish to do harm an opportunity to do so. Parents and carers may need help with having these conversations, especially if they feel they know very little about the many apps available. NSPCC Chat Apps and Have a Conversation contain helpful advice on how to approach this subject with children and young people.
