Special visitors

Year 6 were visited by Prof. Haris and Dr. Luca who both built on our previous work on climate change. Prof. Haris shared with us where energy comes from, how it can be more 'green', and the challenges we face in trying to become more environmentally friendly. We explored trends in energy production through different renewable sources and heard about local projects aimed at adapting energy to become 'greener'. Dr Luca talked to us about the effects that continued global warming will have. We heard about how the supply chain of the food that we eat can vary considerably, and which foods have a particularly big carbon footprint.

Outdoor Adventure

Year 2 went on a Green Day outdoor adventure to our West Jesmond allotment! Here we learned about the conditions plants need in order to thrive and grow. Our expert volunteers showed and talked to us about different types of plants. We even had the opportunity to explore different areas of the allotment such as digging for mini beasts in the beds and pond dipping.

Sustrans Air Pollution Research

Year 4 had a really interesting visit from Ali from Sustrans, who was talking to us all about air pollution and what causes it. She told us that lichen is an indicator of air pollution, so we all became lichen detectives taking our magnifying glasses and clipboards out to search for signs of it around our school grounds!
