Next week we will be taking part in Anti-Bullying Week. We are very proud of the behaviour of our children at West Jesmond. Our West Jesmond Way sets out the aspirations for all of us. Above all, we talk about the need for kindness. No school can ever say that there is no bullying taking place and we know how important it is to empower our children to be able to talk about different behaviours and to speak up when they have worries. We will be talking about the different forms bullying can take, how to define it and what to do if you feel you are affected.

One way we help children to identify if it is bullying is to use **STOP (Several Times On Purpose)**. We then talk to them about what they should do which is **STOP 2 (Start Telling Other People.**
