Dear Parents and Carers,

I want to begin by reassuring parents about our health and hygiene systems in school, which so far, seem to be working very effectively in reducing the number of incidents and potential outbreaks. Many other schools in Newcastle, and even within our Ouseburn Learning Trust, have had some serious issues with multiple year groups having to be sent home to isolate and also a significant number of staff ill or having to isolate making running the school very difficult indeed.

This is not to say that this term we may not face similar challenges but by working together we can try and minimise disruption to the absolute minimum. Our children have been fantastic in adapting to our new routines and thank you for your support with the new start and drop off times. All of this helps to reduce congestion and keep us all safe. The weather has certainly changed now and so wrapping up warm is going to be important on these chilly mornings along with good nutrition to keep the usual coughs and colds at bay.

I also want to remind parents that whilst we encourage and allow parents and children to wear face coverings when coming to and leaving school, for some children and parents, **this is**

not possible. This can be for a whole host of reasons including communication issues and specific medical needs so please be aware and kind to others if they cannot wear a mask when on the school site.

We have secured the school photographer to come into school on **Friday 23rd October** to take **individual photographs** of all the children. We have enhanced COVID security in place for this and have worked with the company for many years. Unfortunately, we will not be able to take wider family or sibling group photographs this year. Online Learning

Mr Jones sent every parent a letter last week clarifying our plan for our home learning processes for children if they are sent home from school or having to self-isolate. As a school we are well ahead with this and there are already resources available for emergency activities through our established links using the national White Rose and Oak Academy resources

If a class is sent home due to an outbreak we will make sure within 24 hours we have specific work online for the class. Our first priority is always to make sure the children are safe and dismissed carefully.

In the event of a national or specific local lockdown again, we will use the same learning platforms, but there will be more enhanced and tailored work including communication with class teachers. I would ask parents to be understanding that even if your child is at home isolating, their class teacher will be working at school teaching the other 29 children in the class.

We are awaiting more information from the Department for Education on possible changes to online learning in the coming weeks.

New Science Resources



some of our children have to put into their daily life in school.


Every one of us faces learning challenges in our daily lives and it is always good to acknowledge and understand those challenges for others.
