



Children's Mental Health Week 2026

Next week is Children's Mental Health Week. In class and in our assemblies, we will be talking about our mental health including how to talk about and recognise how we are feeling. This year's theme explores the vital role of **belonging** in our mental health and wellbeing.

A sense of belonging – whether in our families, schools, peer groups, or wider communities – is a fundamental human need. It helps us feel secure, supported, and ready to learn and grow. When children feel they truly belong, they are more likely to have positive mental health, build healthy relationships, and believe in their ability to make a difference.



We work hard to try to foster that sense of belonging to our school and to our West Jesmond Family and recognise how important it is to our children. However, we know there are days when any one of us could feel vulnerable, alone or anxious and school can sometimes feel a little daunting. We are determined to keep working with our children and with you at home to adapt, develop and improve our school to ensure it feels as warm and welcoming as possible for everyone.



It will be a great opportunity to make connections with other families, find out what support and resources are available in schools and in the community and talk to professionals who can offer advice on a range of issues.

- Skills for People:** work to make sure that disabled people and their families are in control of their lives, are strong, confident and included in the communities of their choice. Offer support and advice for families and offer positive behaviour workshops.
- School Health 0-19 service:** The team offers health advice, support for development, school nursing, and emotional health guidance via a single point of access.
- Welfare Rights:** Welfare rights advisors give free advice to the public to help them get the financial support they are entitled to. They can help you claim benefits if you, your child or relative, have an illness or disability, and they can discuss what you could be entitled to.
- Children and Families Newcastle:** Children and Families Newcastle bring services together so they can support children and families to get the help that they want and need. Children and families can access different services and activities in buildings they know in their local area




Friends of West Jesmond Newsletter
