


Weekly Newsletter: Friday 6th November

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a wonderful first week back exploring the local history of shipbuilding in the area. For me this has been personally significant as the previous 4 generations of my family worked or were closely linked to shipyards on the Wear. As a child, I remember my Dad going off to work with his orange bait box and hearing his stories of ships, welding, machining and metal turning. I remember the smell of him coming home and feeling the oil and grease on his grey ruck sack. I remember the very sad day that I came home aged 12 and my Dad telling me that the shipyards were going to close and he had lost his job. I remember going to my Grandma's house and sitting on the top floor of the bus to look down onto the cold river



and imagine the shipyards; strong, metallic but silent. Seeing the children around school explore this history is a timely reminder of how fast the world moves and has found me reminiscing and long-forgotten memories have come flooding back. I cannot wait to see all the wonderful work the children have done this week and at home.

As we are now in a national lockdown, school will continue to run as normally as possible in line with our new timetable and the agreed risk assessment. The children have adapted really well, but this month will feel very different, especially at weekends. We are continuing with our hygiene regime and class and year group bubbles. So far, this week has been very quiet and safe with no reported cases in school (touch wood) and no classes or small groups of pupils having to be sent home to isolate. I want to reassure parents we have a lot of systems in place if this does need to happen at some point this term and we will communicate directly with you if we need to.

We are also planning our virtual Christmas advent calendar so look out for a wonderful visual treat from each class starting in December. We might not be able to get together as a community at the end of this term, but we are still going to make this term as wonderful and memorable for the children as possible.

Road Safety

Many parents will have noticed that the City Council are now **half-way** through their plans for changes to Tankerville Terrace.

Things have been very difficult this week as there have been cars still parked directly outside the school, blocking the road. The former parking spaces have been removed and double yellow lines will be added shortly to keep this important roadway clear. This will make the scheme much clearer and safer.

It is critical for safety that there are two moving lanes of traffic outside of the school so please do not park and block the road alongside our extended pavement and pedestrian space for COVID safety. There are further planned pedestrian pavement extensions coming on Tankerville Terrace on the other side of the school for Year 5/6 and Reception entrances so watch out for these coming at some point.

Please can I urge all parents to be kind, considerate and patient to each other whilst these road changes are implemented by the City Council.
