





Important Covid Testing Information

Please remember that if your child exhibits any Covid symptoms, you need to book Covid test. Usually, this will involve going to a test centre for a PCR test. If you are unable to get to a test centre speak to the school and we can arrange to drop off a PCR test that you will then send off. The Lateral Flow Tests (LFTs or LFDs) that families can obtain to do twice weekly tests, or that secondary age children are using, are to check for asymptomatic cases and are not the same as the PCR tests used when there are symptoms.

A home LFD test is not enough to end self-isolation for symptomatic children. A child with any symptoms cannot return to school after taking one of the home kit LFD tests and must book a PCR test and wait to hear the result.

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A virtual visit to the museum



Reception children enjoyed a fantastic virtual dinosaur visit to the Great North Museum this week. The brilliant team from the museum led us through a dinosaur experience via Zoom.
