

## West Jesmond Primary Newsletter 4 Autumn Term 2021




Dear Children, Parents and Carers,

### Whole School Local Study Week: Tuesday 2nd November to Friday 5th November

This year our Whole School Local Study week will be The Story of Jesmond. This exciting week will give the children in our school the opportunity to learn more

about the community around them and its history. Children will use maps,



photographs, artefacts, fieldwork and the internet to help them answer their big questions for the week. This will include considering the effects of transport and building use, who the residents are and what community facilities are available. Children will also discover how these have changed over time and how this has affected the area both socially and geographically.
