Our School Our Voice

As you know, one of our big drives this year is to find every way we can to increase our opportunities to hear our children's ideas and suggestions, concerns or worries. This week we have been involved in several wider consultations allowing them to speak up and be heard. Year 4 and Year 6 children have been responding to the Newcastle Health Related Behaviour Survey. We were also very proud to see our children's voices being heard in the Times Education Commission: West Jesmond were one of the few schools in the country selected to take part in this wide reaching research into schools and learning in 2022.

In 2021 the Leader of Newcastle City Council announced a new strategy to ensure that no child or young person is left behind in Newcastle in the wake of the pandemic. To make sure that they can make Newcastle a great place to grow up, they are creating a 'No Child Left Behind' Plan which will inform what happens in the city for the next 8 years. On Wednesday 9th February, Rosie Plummer from the Voice and Influence Team within Newcastle City Council's Children's Services, came in to meet with School Council to hear what we had to say as the young people of Newcastle, to ensure we have our say in what our future, in our city, looks like.
